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Sisters on the Fly embarking the Lewis and Clark Trail

May 22 – June 21, 2017

115 members of Sisters on the Fly, the largest outdoor women's group in the U.S., will embark on a journey of exploration on a great summer road trip, following the Lewis and Clark Trail from May 22 – June 21. With the journey beginning in St. Louis and ending in Astoria, OR, the 32 night, 2,800+ mile trip will take the Sisters through the heartland of America and across stunning mountain ranges in the northwestern states while following the Missouri River north through the Dakotas and winding its way west through Montana, Idaho, Washington and Oregon.

The idea for the trip was born while traveling with 300 sisters on the historic and iconic [Route 66 journey](#) two years ago. One of the sisters who has a passion for exploring American history had another monumental road trip on her bucket list and the planning began. This journey is a celebration not just of the friendships within Sisters on the Fly, but of the a monumental undertaking that changed the future of our country. The Lewis and Clark Trail summer road trip will bring new perspectives as the Sisters explore an integral part of the country's expansion from sea to sea.

With 13 stops along the way, the Expedition participants will hit the majority of important places as they follow the rivers across the land that was part of the Louisiana Purchase. Starting in St. Louis as close to the original departure date of the Corps of Discovery, the sisters will not only enjoy the natural and historical sites, but will have expert guest speakers and presentations by Native Americans around the campfire at night.

This trip, while much longer than most of the hundreds of Sisters On The Fly camping, fishing, and horseback riding trips that take place every year, will bring together women who share the love of adventure and the outdoors. The organization, started by real life sisters Maurrie Sussman and Becky Clarke over twenty years ago, now has a membership roster of over 8500.

“When Sisters on the Fly began in 1998, we were getting together to camp and fish. It is so amazing that today, almost 20 years later, the community is still together and forming events on such a grand scale,” said Maurrie Sussman, founder of Sisters on the Fly. “It's a testament not just to their sense of adventure, but to the way they come together to make something fabulous happen!”
